
WORK . . . Involving mental or physical effort.

Maybe God will bless you in it and give you more. Count on His blessing! We sometimes shrink a little bit. Whatsoever thy hand findeth to do, do it with thy might (Ecclesiastes 9:10). Sometimes we are dealing with difficulties and are not at our best. Sometimes we're tired. Where does our strength come from? Lord, I've been plugged into Your strength! 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PROMOTION from the **NORTH**

Here are some readings from the 75th Psalm: Unto thee, O God, do we give thanks, unto thee do we give thanks: for that thy name is near thy wondrous works declare... I said unto the fools, Deal not foolishly: and to the wicked, Lift not up the horn: For promotion cometh neither from the east, nor from the west, nor from the south.

Properly applying this passage depends a great deal on how one defines promotion. To the carnal mind it can mean many things: money, professional or career advancement, achieving one's goals, perhaps gaining advantage over one's rivals. And yet there is a nature in us all that teaches the truest merit of life is in developing and advancing those character traits that are noble, virtuous, lofty. We are not animals. We are capable of understanding there are things found in relationships and values more important than feeling good or surfeiting in earthly glory.

The Hebrew word ramam, here translated "promotion", actually means "lifting up", and to the Hebrew that did not mean more money or a better job. It meant deliverance from trouble; safety, victory. A father owes his family this kind of promotion; a mother owes it to her children, a judge or ruler owes it to his countrymen. Sad indeed is the family that has not one strong arm in its numbers to protect it from the hazards and hardships of an often unfriendly world; desperate is the community whose leaders seek only their own advantage at the expense of those less able who have entrusted them with power and position in hopes they will use their office with wisdom and charity. So how does one get this promotion? The answer begins with the fountain of all that is noble and upright, therefore sure and secure: Unto Thee, O God, do we give thanks. May His great Name be near us all.

But having God near is not enough by itself; He is already nigh us all. There is a process for us to follow. Promotion does not come from the east, from trusting in the strength and energy of young people, who are taught to "hitch their wagon to a star," to grasp the problems of life and use their stores of resourcefulness and courage to find a path. Nor does it come alone from the west, where grey heads walk the path into the sunset, carrying on their backs and in their hearts the weight of a thousand experiences. It is possible to undergo many a hardship, taste many a pleasure and learn nothing virtuous from them. Promotion that produces deliverance from trouble, safety, and victory does not come from the soft warm south winds that caress the cheek and make balmy the days. It is not possible to learn to have victory over the battles of life by denying them or learning to shift them onto others or evading them.

Promotion comes from the north, which is to say from the cold penetrating winds of hardship and difficulty. Perhaps the greatest meaning of this passage is that the true purpose of human life is to be found in facing all that life has to offer: to taste it to its sweetest and bitterest essence. That means to unflinchingly face the monsters of grief and sorrow we naturally dread; to refuse to shrink from physical illness or deformity, or from standing for the right when great personal loss is the likely consequence. Who can say he has truly lived life who has spent his time in a vacuum, facing nothing, achieving nothing? And who is made better by facing life's adversities if their consequence has been to bend and embitter him until he no longer believes in anything? There is little sadder than an old person in whom the light has gone out.

Nor are the challenges of life all negative. As Rudyard Kipling put it, "If you can meet with triumph and disaster, and treat those two impostors just the same..." Success, praise, too much fame and recognition, money and position have ruined many a young and promising life. The answer is that we need something greater than any of us - lead me to the Rock that is higher than I. God's grace, flowing like sweet water into our thirsty souls, can keep us clean and sound inside, so that the north wind develops us into the persons God meant us to be. Have you talked to Him today? These interesting scriptures are found in Matthew 12:38-40. "Then certain of the scribes and of the Pharisees answered, saying, Master, we would see a sign from thee. But he answered and said unto them, An evil and adulterous generation seeketh after a sign; and there shall no sign be given to it, but the sign of the prophet Jonas: For as Jonas was three days and three nights in the whale's belly; so shall the Son of man be three days and three nights in the heart of the earth.

The Israelite theological and government leaders who made this request probably had in mind something of the sort that had accompanied God's visit at Sinai, when there was a visible cloud showing God's presence in the daylight and a pillar of fire by night, as well as the other ways He had shown Himself while giving the Ten Commandments and the other parts of the law to Moses. Although Jesus had worked many miracles, in essence these leaders were saying, "The things that happened in Moses' time are what convinced our forefathers of God's way in the law He first gave; You are now claiming to bring a new law. Should we not expect to have the same or greater examples of God's working if what You say is true?"

But Jesus was not impressed with their logic, for truth needs no supporting thunder and fire; it is what it is. It is always right for people to love their enemies, bless those who curse them, render to no one evil for evil. On the face of it, what a strange witness He provided them! Except in one point, Jonah and Jesus were as opposite as it is possible for two people to be. Jonah refused his commission; Jesus gladly accepted His. Jonah tried to run away from God; the Lord submitted to His Father's will, and proceeded to the place in which He was to do God's bidding. Jonah grumbled when people repented in Nineveh; Christ rejoiced when even one sinner saw the error of his ways.

Yet, in the midst of these contrasts, one glorious detail eternally linked the prophet with the Son of God. "For as Jonas was three days and three nights in the whale's belly; so shall the Son of man be three days and three nights in the heart of the earth." Think about this: when Nicodemus, a seeking sinner, asked for help, the Lord pointed toward the cross. When that cross approached, when Nicodemus sat in the council of the Sanhedrin as it unlawfully discussed murdering Jesus, he tried to prevent that in his timid, half-hearted way. Was it enough to exonerate him from the innocent blood? Surely he felt a crushing weight of guilt when he went to Pilate to beg the body of Jesus after the awful scene of the crucifixion to prepare it for burial. No doubt that cross took on enormous spiritual meaning to him in the later years of his life.

Similarly, when hypocritical Pharisees asked for a sign, Jesus spoke of His resurrection. What a staggering indictment must that have been to them, they who conspired together to couple the cross and the tomb, all without knowing they were in fact acting only as God permitted! Their asking for a sign such as happened with Moses was a suggestion that if such a sign were given they would be obedient to Jesus' message. One has to wonder if when news came that Jesus was not in the tomb, that observers from the Roman soldiers who were to keep the tomb to great numbers of His disciples could positively assert that He was risen, those words of Jesus did not come back to their minds with punishing force. Did they think then of the implied pledge they had made the Lord that if the proper signs were present they would believe? How great must have been the horror that shocked their hearts when the first strong shouts of a resurrected Messiah began to be heard where they were!

And what of us today? What signs must the Lord show for us to believe? Let us beware that we not reject them because they are subtle, not as we expected, on silent angel wings rather than noisy carnal lips. Have you talked to God today?

Too Much Food and Time by Sis. Charlotte Huskey

"Pride goeth before destruction, and a haughty spirit before a fall." Pro. 16:18

Have you heard the Bible story about two cities, Sodom and Gomorrah? It is found in Genesis13. It says, "But the men of Sodom were wicked and sinners before the Lord exceedingly." Eventually, hot brimstone (something like an erupting volcano), fell from the sky burying both cities.

Did you ever wonder what was happening in these cities before they became so wicked? The Bible tells us: "...this was the iniquity of ... Sodom, pride, fulness of bread, and abundance of idleness ...neither did she strengthen the hand of the poor and needy. And they were haughty, and committed abomination before me: therefore, I took them away" (Ezek. 16:49-50). A wise proverb of King Solomon is, "Pride goeth before destruction, and a haughty spirit before a fall ." Pride, plenty of food and idle time was what caused the inhabitants of Sodom to fall into wickedness. If they had had to work hard to have food, perhaps they might have avoided the catastrophe.

Are we allowing our children to follow a path toward wickedness when we keep them full of food and give them time to be idle? An old wise saying is, "An idle mind is the devils workshop." Shouldn't all children have responsibilities equal to their ability? Even small children can be responsible for keeping themselves and their room clean, doing school homework and helping with family chores. Other responsibilities should be added as they grow. By the time they are young adults they should be working and paying for some of their clothes, their car, it's insurance, gas and repairs, unless they are devoted to studying. When parents supply their needs, they have more time to experiment with sin. Parents are in essence giving their children "fullness of bread and abundance of idleness" – the very things that caused Sodom to decline. A busy child will be tired at night. He will sleep instead of staying awake doing things that are not constructive.

Another sin of Sodom was that they did not "strengthen the poor and needy." While we are living a standard better than that of kings in former ages, the poor barely exist in their miserable conditions. What are we doing to strengthen the poor? Do we even share our abundance with them? Much of our abundance is thrown in the trash: half an apple, vegetables we don't like, leftover food, that could be saved for another meal, etc. What kind of example are we showing the next generation? On the other hand, we can huddle in our comforts with them and await the outcome. God help us to save ourselves and our families from "pride, fullness of bread, abundance of idleness, and ignoring the poor."

Stability from the Word of God

The Spirit of the Lord will show us the right way. What happened to Christ wasn't right, but He had the right spirit. He demonstrated to us that it's not about us but the cause. As we read the Word of God, the emotions will loose their grip. We are facing volatile times with one motive, to provoke us. We know it's wrong to be provoked; there is a right way to handle it. If we come across a boundary, don't cross what the Word of God says. It will bring civility, peace, comfort and understanding with what to do in our lives. And we won't be carried away. But if we don't take time for the Word of God, then [our emotions] will overwhelm us. Our only hope of Heaven is being rooted and grounded in the Word of God. That's the place of safety and stability.


